The Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission Launches 2025 Licensing Round for 50 Oil and Gas Blocks

The Nigerian Upstream Petroleum Regulatory Commission (“NUPRC”) has announced its 2025 licensing round, offering Fifty (50) oil and gas blocks across onshore, shallow water and deepwater locations with a target of Ten Billion United States Dollars (US\$10,000,000,000.00) in investment tied to the bid cycle, Two Billion (2,000,000,000) barrels of oil and an estimated Four Hundred Thousand (400,000) barrels per day of production volumes, when the blocks become fully operational. The round aims to attract fresh investment and expand Nigeria's hydrocarbon reserves.

It was reported that the NUPRC has scheduled a pre-bid conference for December 17, 2025, in Lagos, with promotional international roadshows planned in Dubai, Singapore, Beijing and Houston. Interested parties can access full licensing details, including participation instructions and block descriptions, through the NUPRC's dedicated online portal.

The Transmission Company of Nigeria completes over thirty (30) Transmission Projects, raising Nigeria's Grid Capacity

The Transmission Company of Nigeria (“TCN”) has announced the completion of more than thirty (30) transmission projects nationwide, hence significantly enhancing the nation's electricity infrastructure. According to the Executive Director, Transmission Service Provider of the Transmission Company of Nigeria (TCN), Engineer Oluwagbenga Ajiboye, the projects include new substations and transmission lines implemented through strategic investments and partnerships with institutions such as the World Bank, whilst being supported by Nigeria's Electricity Transmission Project (“NETAP”).

It was also reported that the TCN has recorded advanced major grid upgrades through the Nigerian Electricity Grid Maintenance, Expansion, and Rehabilitation Program (NEGMRP), including reconductoring old transmission lines, installing new transformers and improving digital grid visibility through the leverage of Internet of Things (IoT)-enabled monitoring systems.

Dangote Refinery to Commence Supply of Fifty Million (50,000,000) Litres of Petroleum from December 1, 2025

Dangote Petroleum Refinery (the “Refinery”) announced that it will commence the supply of Fifty Million (50,000,000) litres of Premium Motor Spirit (“PMS”) per day from December 1, 2025, as part of its plan to deliver One Billion, Five Hundred Million (1,500,000,000) litres monthly through December and into early 2026. This pledge to supply PMS is also considered a major intervention to prevent recurring holiday fuel scarcity.

It was also reported that the Refinery intends to increase PMS supply to One Billion, Seven Hundred Million (1,700,000,000) litres by February 2026, reflecting a supply of Fifty-Seven Million (57,000,000) litres of PMS per day, alongside an expansion toward the increase of the Refinery's capacity to One Million, Four Hundred Thousand Barrels Per Day (1,400,000bpd).

NCDMB and NEXIM Disburse Forty-Two Million United States Dollars (\$42,000,000.00) to Strengthen Indigenous Capacity in Nigeria's Oil and Gas Sector

The Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (“**NCDMB**”) and the Nigerian Export-Import Bank (“**NEXIM**”) disbursed Forty-Two Million United States Dollars (US\$42,000,000.00) to Small and Medium Enterprises (“**SMEs**”) to deepen local participation in Nigeria's Oil and Gas industry. The intervention, which surpasses the initial Thirty Million United States Dollars (US\$30,000,000.00) allocation, forms part of ongoing efforts to expand indigenous capacity and enhance competitiveness across the sector.

The disbursement aligns with the objectives of the forthcoming Practical Nigerian Content (“**PNC**”) Forum 2025, themed “Securing Investment, Strengthening Local Content, and Scaling Energy Production”, aimed at driving project delivery efficiencies, domestic content performance, technological innovation and broader economic conditions for Nigerians under the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development (“**NOGICD**”) Act.

NDPHC Restores 450MW, Recovers Dormant Turbines to Boost the National Grid

The Niger Delta Power Holding Company (“**NDPHC**”) has announced restoration of Four Hundred and Fifty Megawatts (450MW) generation capacity to the national grid following completion of the scheduled maintenance at the Geregu National Integrated Power Project (NIPP) plant, in Kogi State (the “**Plant**”). The intervention was conducted to improve the Plant's reliability, efficiency and operational lifespan.

The Managing Director of NDPHC, Jennifer Adighije, stated that over the last 1 year, the NDPHC has recovered six (6) previously dormant gas turbines across its Calabar, Omotosho II, Benin, Sapele and Alaoji NIPP plants. Ms Adighije disclosed that these restored units collectively provide up to 875MW of additional mechanical capacity while also stating the commencement of restoration works on the long-idle 225MW Gbarain NIPP plant, aimed at supporting Industrial and commercial clusters in the Niger Delta.
